

BUSINESS AND PROFESSION LICENSE CODE

ORDINANCE NO. 1

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LICENSE TAXES ON BUSINESSES, PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS IN THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE, THE SCHEDULE AND AMOUNT OF SUCH LICENSE TAXES, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the City Commission is of the opinion that it is necessary for the immediate protection and preservation of the peace, safety, health, and property of the City and its inhabitants, and to provide for the usual daily operation of the City and its departments that this Ordinance be enacted and take effect immediately, therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. No persons shall engage in or manage the businesses, occupations or professions enumerated in Section 25 and required to be licensed by the City, without first having paid the amount of license tax required for each separate location in the city, for the use of the city, and having obtained a city license therefor.

Section 2. Except as otherwise provided, licenses shall expire on the thirtieth day of September of each year. No license shall be issued for more than one year. Any person who shall operate or continue to operate a business without having either taken out a new license or renewed an existing license by November first, shall be subject to a fifteen per cent penalty in addition to the standard license, and after December first shall be subject to provisions of Section 24 of this ordinance.

Section 3. Unless otherwise provided for each license obtained between October first and April first the full tax for one year shall be paid, and for each license obtained from April first to September thirtieth, one-half the full tax for one year shall be paid.

Section 4. Every person engaged in or managing any business, profession or occupation referred to in Section 25 in the city, is required to procure a city license as herein provided and shall, on or before October first of each year, and always before engaging in any business, profession or occupation, file an application on the prescribed form with the City Treasurer and Collector, signed by an officer, partner or owner of the business. All licenses shall be applied for and issued in the real name of the applicant; in cases where the applicant has qualified under the laws of the state for the use of a fictitious name, the license, if issued, shall show the real name as well as the fictitious name of the applicant. In such application, the applicant shall set forth the name of the owner (if a firm, the name of all members of the firm; if a corporation, the names of all officers of the Corporation), the location of the business, the full name of the business; where the license tax is based thereon, the value of stock carried or the number of seats, machines, employees, gasoline, pumps, rooms or vehicles, or other such items used, as the case may be; and such other pertinent information as may be prescribed by the City Treasurer and Collector.

Section 5. Any license obtained under the provisions of this chapter upon a misrepresentation of a material fact shall be deemed null and void, and the licensee who has thereafter engaged in any business under such license shall be subject to prosecution for doing business without a license to the same effect and degree as though no such license had ever been issued.

Section 6. Whenever in this chapter a license tax is based upon or determined by the "value of stock carried", the value of stock carried shall be the cost value of all stock in trade and merchandise on hand as of the close of the calendar year, unless the merchant operates on a fiscal year differing from calendar year in which event the value shall be as of the end of the fiscal year of the licensee next preceding the start of the license period in question. Where the license is not a renewal license or the licensee has not completed one fiscal year, then the value of stock carried shall be the cost value of all stock in trade and merchandise on hand as of the date of commencement of business. The true value of stock carried, as above defined, shall be stated by the applicant in his application for a license or for a renewal of license.

In the event an applicant for a license fails or refuses to state or set forth the value of stock carried, as above defined, or sets forth such value inaccurately, the City Treasurer and Collector of the City shall fix and determine such value from any information in his possession, and the value so fixed shall be used to determine the amount of license tax due the city.

Section 7. In the event of a disagreement between applicant and the city on the question or proper classification of any business, occupation or profession for license purposes, the City Treasurer and Collector shall decide the proper classification, with the right of the applicant to appeal from such decision to the City Commission whose decision upon the point shall be final.

Section 8. All licenses provided for herein shall be issued for and apply to only one place of business within the City.

Section 9. It is unnecessary for the city to send out bills or notices to persons engaged in business in the city with respect to the payment or nonpayment of license taxes.

Section 10. Nothing in this article shall be construed to require a license for amateur entertainments of any kind or description.

Section 11. Every license shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the place of business for which it is issued and the holder of such license shall exhibit same to the City Treasurer and Collector, his deputy, or any police officer upon being requested to do so by any of them.

Section 12. Licenses may be transferred from one location to another, provided, the licenses are presented to the City Treasurer and Collector for the approval of such transfer, and provided further, no such license shall be transferred without the approval of the City Commission where any question of zoning arises, and provided further the licensee shall pay for such transfer a fee in the amount of One Dollar if the transfer is applied for before the business is moved to the new location, and Two Dollars if the transfer is applied for after the business is moved.

Section 13. No transferable license shall be transferred from the person to whom it is issued, except upon written application of the transferee, endorsed by the transferor, made to the City Treasurer and Collector, and when such application is so made the City Treasurer and Collector shall issue a duplicate of the original license, marked "duplicate", and shall endorse thereon the names of the transferees.

Section 14. In the event there should occur any conflict in the terms, provisions or conditions of the license provisions, the highest license fee prescribed hereunder or in any ordinance shall be paid, and shall be the license fee required for such business, profession or occupation, or occupation.

Section 15. When any person engaged in merchantile or other business in the city shall make an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or when any such person shall be adjudicated a voluntary or an involuntary bankrupt or declared insolvent, any license theretofore issued authorizing such person to do business in the city shall immediately be terminated and shall, upon such assignment for the benefit of creditors or upon such adjudication in bankruptcy, immediately become null and void.

Section 16. The license of any person for the operation of any business may be revoked by the City Commission at any time, upon notice and hearing for violation of any of the provisions of this code or ordinances of the city or laws of the state, or for any other good and sufficient reason; provided, however, this section shall not affect the power of the municipal court to revoke certain licenses where such revocation is specifically provided for by ordinance.

Section 17. Where any question of zoning arises, no license shall be issued hereunder for any business, occupation or profession until the location thereof shall have first been approved by the City Commission. Any license issued in violation of the zoning laws of the city shall be invalid and the amount of the license paid shall be refunded to the licensee and the erroneous issuance of said license shall not authorize the licensee to do business at any location in violation of the zoning laws.

Section 18. The amount of any license tax and penalty imposed by the provisions of this chapter is hereby declared to be a debt due to the city, and any person carrying on any business without first having procured a license from the city so to do, shall be liable to the city for the amount of such license tax recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Section 19. For the purpose of replacing any mutilated, destroyed or lost license certificate receipt relating to any occupational license granted by the city, the City Treasurer and Collector is hereby authorized and empowered to cause to be executed and delivered an appropriate duplicate license certificate or receipt, upon the submission of evidence satisfactory to the City Treasurer and Collector that the original certificate or receipt was mutilated, destroyed or lost, and upon the holder of such original furnishing the city with indemnity satisfactory to the City Treasurer and Collector, and upon the payment to the city by the holder of the sum of One Dollar for each such duplicate license certificate or receipt executed and delivered hereunder.

Section 20. Any occupational license issued by the city authorizing the conducting of the business of pawnbroker and secondhand dealer shall be granted and issued only after the City Commission has first approved on its minutes the operator and the location within the city at which such business may be carried on.

Section 21. All licensed junk dealers in the city are required to keep a written record of all purchases of goods made by them showing the time and place of purchase, and the person from whom purchased, which record shall at all times be open to inspection by the police officers of the city. Said records shall in a general way describe the articles purchased, the approximate time of day purchased, the name of the person from whom purchased, and a short description of the person by whom the same are purchased.

Section 22. This chapter shall not be construed to authorize gambling or the operation of a lottery, or the operation of any machine, contrivance or device prohibited by law.

Section 23. The City Treasurer and Collector may make such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with this chapter, as may be necessary or proper for the enforcement of the provisions hereof.

Section 24. If any person shall engage in, transact, manage or be the agent for any other person in the carrying on of any of the businesses, professions or occupations set forth in the chapter without first procuring a license within thirty (30) days after receiving notice in the case of permanently established places of businesses and residents, required by this chapter, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or serve a term not to exceed sixty (60) days in the city jail of the City of Port St. Joe, or both such fine and sentence, in the discretion of the Municipal Judge. A transient or non-resident person shall be guilty of violating this ordinance unless immediately securing such license upon beginning a business in the city.

Section 25. The following licenses shall be paid as hereinafter provided by all persons engaging in, managing, operating or running any of the professions, businesses, or occupations following:
