

# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE, FLORIDA, HELD AT 2775 GARRISON AVENUE, October 7, 2025, at Noon.

The following were present: Mayor pro tem Lowry, Commissioners Hoffman, Kerigan, and Langston. City Manager Jim Anderson, City Clerk Charlotte Pierce, Deputy Clerk Carrie Fodge, and City Attorney Clinton McCahill were also present. Mayor Buzzett was absent, and Mayor pro tem Lowry chaired the meeting.

#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

#### Minutes

A Motion was made by Commissioner Langston, second by Commissioner Hoffman, to approve the Minutes of the Special Meeting of September 22, 2025. All in favor; Motion carried 4-0.

#### **City Attorney**

Attorney McCahill shared that the injunction against Tallulah has been filed.

#### City Engineer – Josh Baxley

City Government Complex

The Geotechnical report is currently being compiled. Dewberry expects the report to be completed within the next two weeks.

Downtown Utilities Phase 2

Dewberry is waiting on the as-builts and final pay request from the contractor.

HMGP Grant - Elevation of 12 Lift Stations

This project began on October 1 and is being done by Kenny Strange Electric.

Downtown Alleys Drainage Improvements

Dewberry is waiting for the survey.

Avenue A Stormwater

Dewberry is waiting for this survey

#### **Old Business**

City Projects

There were no questions from the Commissioners about the current City Projects.

#### **New Business**

Pickleball Courts at the Washington Gym Complex - Commissioner Langston

A Motion was made by Commissioner Hoffman, second by Commissioner Langston, to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with the County, each committing \$50,000 with the stipulation that the County show up with their money.

Christy McElory shared her opinion on this issue.

All in favor; Motion carried 4-0.

Offer to Purchase Property

Denise Vickers of Keller Williams and Jeff Bray of PEA Inc., representing Liberty Networks, offered to purchase Parcel 03072-005R, approximately 3 Acres, from the City for \$500,000 cash to locate a Telecom Exchange Building on.

Attorney McCahill shared that, because of Deed restrictions, the St. Joe Company would have to approve the request.

Christy McElroy, Robert Branch, and Marvin Davis shared their opinions on this issue.

A Motion was made by Commissioner Langston, second by Commissioner Kerigan, to Table this issue. Motion passed 3-1. Voting in favor were Commissioners Langston, Kerigan, and Mayor protem Lowry. Voting against was Commissioner Hoffman.

#### Public Works – John Grantland

County Road Patch Invoices

Invoices have been received from the County for road patching. In the past, the City has made the repairs through a contractor for approximately \$1,000 per patch. The County has entered into an agreement with Robert and Roberts for road work eliminating the City's ability to repair roads. The County invoice for 3 repairs was \$19,125 and additional invoices totaling \$36,558 are proposed for four more patches.

City Staff was instructed to reach out to County Staff to discuss this as the City was not aware of this agreement until the invoices were received from the County.

RFP 2025-06 Washington Gym Roof Project

A Motion was made by Commissioner Hoffman, second by Commissioner Langston, to award RFP 2025-06 to the low bidder, Monolith Construction in the amount of \$101,330.43 for roofing of the Reading Room, Kitchen, and front area.

Christy McElroy shared her concerns about the project.

All in favor; Motion carried 4-0.

#### RFP 2025-07 City Commission Chambers Roof

A Motion was made by Commissioner Langston, second by Commissioner Hoffman, to award RFP 2025-07 to the low bidder, Lewis Walker Roofing in the amount of \$39,772.82. All in favor; Motion carried 4-0.

#### Surface Water Plant – Larry McClamma

A Motion was made by Commissioner Kerigan, second by Commissioner Langston, to award RFP 2025-08 to the following.

50% Membrane Grade Caustic Soda to Odyssey Mfg., in the amount of \$2.75 per gallon. Ferric Sulfate to Pencco, Inc., in the amount of \$469 per dry ton.

All in favor; Motion carried 4-0.

#### **Wastewater Plant**

Mr. Harris was detained at the plant and unable to attend the meeting.

#### Finance Director

FEMA Update

Mr. Lacour shared that the forensic audit is complete, and reimbursement is still in Step 6 of 8.

Grants Reimbursement Update

Mr. Lacour is moving forward on grant reimbursements.

#### **Code Enforcement**

Mr. Anderson noted issues with unlawful accumulation and asked that residents please take their accumulation of debris to the landfill.

#### Police Department - Chief Richards

Lenslock Contract Amendment

A Motion was made by Commissioner Kerigan, second by Commissioner Hoffman, approving Chief Richards to sign the amendment to this contract for approximately \$2,500 per year.

Robert Brach shared his opinion on this matter.

All in favor; Motion carried 4-0.

Request to Purchase Low Speed Vehicle on State Contract

A Motion was made by Commissioner Kerigan, second by Commissioner Hoffman, to approve applying for a Low Speed Vehicle on State Contract in the amount of \$22,680. Grant funding in the amount of \$22,625.00 is available for this purchase.

Christy McElroy shared her thoughts on this item.

All in favor; Motion carried 4-0.

#### City Clerk - Charlotte Pierce

Grants Update

Clerk Pierce reported there have been no significant changes in the grants listed on pages 46 - 47, and City Staff continues to work on grant projects daily.

Christmas Parade

Ms. Pierce shared that the Christmas Parade will be on Saturday, December 13, 2025, beginning at 6 PM. She noted that inquiries are being received about the parade and encouraged the Commissioners to begin planning their entry for the parade.

A Motion was made by Commissioner Langston, second by Commissioner Kerigan, to request a permit from the FDOT to have the parade on Highway 98 from Eighth Street to First Street on Saturday, December 13, 2025, beginning at 6 PM and lasting until 8 PM. All in favor; Motion carried 4-0.

#### Citizens to be Heard

Katie McCullers, Robert Branch, and Christy McElroy shared their opinions on various topics.

#### **Discussion Items by Commissioners**

Neither Commissioners Langston nor Kerigan had any additional information to share with the Commission.

Commissioner Hoffman shared his concerns about the City maintaining equipment at the Herron Walk Lift Station. He also noted that numerous people are enjoying the Golf Course on Sixteenth Street, there has been a lot of support for the improvements to it, and he wants to see the City continue to cut the grass and support the site.

Mayor pro tem Lowry wants to see the City continue to cut the grass at the Golf Course for residents to use and enjoy the area.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 624**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FUTURE LAND USE MAP OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE, FLORIDA BY AND THROUGH PROCEDURES REQUIRED FOR SMALL-SCALE MAP AMENDMENTS PURSUIT TO AUTHORITY UNDER STATE STATUES SECTION 163.3187, SPECIFICALLY CHANGING PARCEL ID NUMBER 04707-000R FROM PUBLIC USE TO COMMERCIAL, PROVIDING FOR THE AMENDMENT OF THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE FROM PUBLIC USE PU TO COMMERCIAL C-1; AND PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ANY CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 163.3187, Florida Statutes, provides for the authority and procedure for the City Commission of Port St. Joe, Florida to amend its Comprehensive Plan utilizing procedures applicable to small scale developments; and

WHEREAS, on October 7, 2025, the Planning and Development Review Board sitting as the local planning agency for the City, recommended approval of the small-scale amendment to the comprehensive plan and amendment to the Zoning Map of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to adopt the amendment to the current comprehensive plan to guide and control the future development of the City, and to preserve, promote, and protect the public health, safety, and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE, FLORIDA:

#### SECTION 1. APPROVAL

The City of Port St. Joe Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map and Zoning Map are hereby amended as set forth on Exhibit "A" and are hereby changed from Public Use land use to Commercial and the Zoning from Public Use PU to Commercial C-1. The application and all documentation submitted by the Applicant in support of it are hereby incorporated by reference.

# SECTION 2. CONSISTENCY WITH CITY OF PORT ST. JOE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The Board of City Commissioners hereby finds and determines that the approval of the amendment is consistent with the goals, objectives and policies of the City of Port St. Joe Comprehensive Plan as amended.

#### SECTION 3. ENFORCEMENT

The City may enforce this Ordinance as authorized by law.

#### SECTION 4. FUTURE LAND USE MAP

Upon this Ordinance becoming effective, the City of Port St. Joe Future Land Use Map shall be amended to show the Property as having a land use of Commercial.

#### **SECTION 5. ZONING**

The Zoning map of the City of Port St. Joe is hereby amended to show the property described in Exhibit "A" as Commercial C-1.

#### SECTION 6. REPEAL

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

#### SECTION 7. SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application thereof, to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.

#### SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE




JOE, FLORIDA, TO SUPPORT AND APPROVE THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES PURSUANT TO COMPLETION OF THE RESURFACING, RESTORATION AND REHABILITATION OF STATE ROAD (SR) 30 (US 98) FROM WEST OF ST. JOE INLET TO INTRACOASTAL WATERWAY (ICWW) BRIDGE AS PART OF FPID 450808-1-52-01; PROVIDING FOR TRANSMITTAL OF THE RESOLUTION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, in Fiscal Year 2026, the Florida Department of Transportation (hereinafter referred to as the "Department") proposes to undertake and complete a resurfacing, restoration, and rehabilitation project on State Road (SR) 30 (US 98)) in Gulf County, Florida, FPID Number 450808-1-52-01 (hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT"); and

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission of the City of Port St. Joe supports the Department's efforts in these regards; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary to temporarily close Fourth Street, Third Street, and Avenue C for an approximate duration of 25 days and detour traffic to roads owned and maintained by the City of Port St. Joe to successfully complete the Project; and

WHEREAS, said road closures allow for construction of drainage improvements to repair storm pipe failures within SR 30, minimize impacts to the traveling public, and minimize construction duration; and

**WHEREAS**, said road closures will be performed in accordance with the Department's Temporary Traffic Control Plan, attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit A**, including any updates and/or revisions thereof as exist on file with the Department for this Project (the "Plan").

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PORT ST. JOE that:** 

- 1. The above stated recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. The City Commission of the City of Port St. Joe does hereby authorize the Department temporarily closing Fourth Street, Third Street, and Avenue C in accordance with the Plan.
- 3. The City of Port St. Joe does hereby agree the City will continue to maintain City-owned detour roads during construction of the PROJECT.

# LOCALLY FUNDED AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND CITY OF PORT ST JOE, FLORIDA

Project No: 450808-1-52-02

This Locally Funded Agreement ("AGREEMENT") is between the **State of Florida**, **Department of Transportation** ("DEPARTMENT"), and **City of Port St. Joe**, **Florida**, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("PARTICIPANT").

#### **RECITALS**

- 1. The DEPARTMENT is preparing to resurface SR 30 (US 98) FROM W OF ST JOE INLET BRIDGE TO ICWW BRIDGE Financial Project Identification Number 450808-1. The construction will include but is not limited to procurement and installation of patterned pavement (Project ID 450808-1-52-02) and shall be called the PROJECT for purposes of this AGREEMENT; and
- 2. The DEPARTMENT will undertake and administer the PROJECT, and PARTICIPANT will pay for the costs of the PROJECT.

	DEPARTMENT is authorized to enter into this AGREEMENT by Section 339.12, Florida Statutes, F.S., and other sections of the Florida Transportation Code, and PARTICIPANT has approved this AGREEMENT and authorized its duly authorized representative to sign on its behalf as set forth in the attached Resolution No:, dated
--	--

Therefore, the DEPARTMENT and the PARTICIPANT agree as follows:

- 4. The facts stated in the recitals above in Paragraphs 1-3 are true and correct and are incorporated into and made a part of this AGREEMENT.
- 5. The PARTICIPANT agrees that it will, within fourteen (14) calendar days from the DEPARTMENT'S written notice to the PARTICIPANT, furnish the DEPARTMENT an advance deposit in the amount of FORTY-ONE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED EIGHTY-SEVEN AND 00/100 DOLLARS (\$41,487), for purposes of funding PROJECT. The DEPARTMENT may utilize the amount of the deposit stated above for payment of the costs of the PROJECT.
- 6. The DEPARTMENT may, in its discretion, decide to delay or cancel the PROJECT without liability to the DEPARTMENT, if the PARTICIPANT fails to furnish the advance deposit as provided for in Paragraph 5 of this AGREEMENT.
- 7. Procurement for PROJECT shall be conducted according to DEPARTMENT'S standard procurement procedures for this type of PROJECT, including but not limited to bidding procedures. If the accepted bid amount is in excess of the advance deposit amount, the PARTICIPANT will

provide an additional deposit within fourteen (14) calendar days of notification from the DEPARTMENT or prior to posting of the accepted bid, whichever is earlier, so that the total deposit is equal to the bid amount. The DEPARTMENT will notify the PARTICIPANT as soon as it becomes apparent the accepted bid amount is in excess of the advance deposit amount. However, failure of the DEPARTMENT to so notify the PARTICIPANT shall not relieve the PARTICIPANT from its obligation to pay for its full participation on final accounting as provided herein below. If the PARTICIPANT cannot provide the additional deposit within fourteen (14) days, a letter must be submitted to and approved by the DEPARTMENT's project manager indicating when the deposit will be made. The PARTICIPANT understands the request and approval of the additional time could delay the PROJECT, and additional costs may be incurred due to a delay of the PROJECT.

- 8. If the accepted bid amount is less than the advance deposit amount, the DEPARTMENT will retain the amount of the deposit stated in Paragraph 5 until completion of final accounting, at which point the terms set forth in Paragraph 10 or Paragraph 11, as appropriate, will be followed.
- 9. Should PROJECT modifications or changes occur that increase the PARTICIPANT's share of total PROJECT costs, the PARTICIPANT will be notified by the DEPARTMENT accordingly. The PARTICIPANT agrees to provide, without delay, in advance of the additional work being performed, adequate funds to ensure that cash on deposit with the DEPARTMENT is sufficient to fully fund the PROJECT. The DEPARTMENT shall notify the PARTICIPANT as soon as it becomes apparent the actual costs will overrun the award amount. However, failure of the DEPARTMENT to so notify the PARTICIPANT shall not relieve the PARTICIPANT from its obligation to pay for the PROJECT during the PROJECT and on final accounting as provided herein below. Funds due from the PARTICIPANT during the PROJECT not paid within forty (40) calendar days from the date of the invoice are subject to an interest charge at a rate established pursuant to Section 55.03, F.S.
- 10. The DEPARTMENT intends to have its final and complete accounting of all costs incurred in connection with the work performed hereunder within three hundred and sixty (360) days of final payment to the consultant. The DEPARTMENT considers the project complete when the final payment has been made to the contractor, not when the construction work is complete. All project cost records and accounts shall be subject to audit by a representative of the PARTICIPANT for a period of three (3) years after final close out of the project. The PARTICIPANT will be notified of the final costs. Both Parties agree that in the event the final accounting of the total project costs pursuant to the terms of this AGREEMENT is less than the total amounts deposited to date, a refund of the excess will be made by the DEPARTMENT to the PARTICIPANT If the final accounting is not performed within three hundred and sixty (360) days, the PARTICIPANT is not relieved from its obligation to pay.
- 11. In the event the final accounting of total project costs is greater than the total deposits to date, the PARTICIPANT will pay the additional amount within forty (40) calendar days from the date of the invoice from the DEPARTMENT. The PARTICIPANT agrees to pay interest at a rate as established pursuant to Section 55.03, F.S., on any invoice not paid within forty (40) calendar days until the invoice is paid.
- 12. The payment of funds under this AGREEMENT will be made directly to the DEPARTMENT for

deposit and as provided in the attached Three-Party Escrow Agreement between PARTICIPANT, DEPARTMENT and the State of Florida, Department of Financial Services, Division of Treasury.

The DEPARTMENT shall require a statement from the Comptroller of the Department that funds are available prior to entering into any such contract or other binding commitment of funds. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the making of contracts for periods exceeding 1 year, but any contract so made shall be executory only for the value of the services to be rendered or agreed to be paid for in succeeding fiscal years; and this paragraph shall be incorporated verbatim in all contracts of the DEPARTMENT which are for an amount in excess of \$25,000.00 and which have a term for a period of more than 1 year.

- 15. This document incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements, or understanding applicable to the matters contained in this agreement and the Parties agree that there are no commitments, agreements or understanding concerning the subject matter of this AGREEMENT that are not contained in this document. Accordingly, it is agreed that no deviation from the terms of this AGREEMENT shall be predicated upon any prior representation or agreements whether oral or written. It is further agreed that no modification, amendment, or alteration in the terms or conditions contained in this AGREEMENT shall be effective unless contained in a written properly executed document.
- 16. This AGREEMENT shall not be more strictly construed against either party because one party drafted or prepared any or all of the terms and provisions.

- 17. This AGREEMENT shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.
- 18. This AGREEMENT may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be an original but all of which shall be deemed to be but one agreement.

## 19. The PARTICIPANT:

- (a) Shall utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the PARTICIPANT during the term of the contract; and
- (b) Shall expressly require any subcontractors performing work or providing services pursuant to the state contract to likewise utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the subcontractor during the contract term.
- 20. This AGREEMENT shall become effective when all Parties have signed it. The date this AGREEMENT is signed by the last party, as indicated by the date set out under that party's signature, shall be deemed the date of this AGREEMENT.

- 1. An initial deposit will be made into an interest-bearing escrow account established hereunder for the purposes of the Project. The escrow account will be opened with the Escrow Agent on behalf of FDOT upon Escrow Agent's receipt and execution of this Agreement.
- 2. Other deposits to the escrow account may be made during the life of this agreement.

- 6. Unless instructed otherwise by FDOT, all interest accumulated in the escrow account shall remain in the account for the purposes of the Project.
- 7. The Escrow Agent agrees to provide written confirmation of receipt of funds to FDOT. FDOT agrees to provide a copy of such written confirmation to Participant upon request.
- 8. The Escrow Agent further agrees to provide quarterly reports to FDOT concerning the escrow account. FDOT agrees to provide a copy of such quarterly reports to Participant upon request.
- 9. The Escrow Agent shall not be liable for any error of judgment or for any act done or omitted by it in good faith, or for anything which it may in good faith do or refrain from doing in connection herewith.
- 10. Escrow Agent shall have no liability for any claim, cost, expense, damage or loss due to the acts or omissions of FDOT and Participant, nor from any separate agreements between FDOT and Participant and shall have no responsibility to monitor or enforce any responsibilities herein or in any separate agreements associated with this Agreement between FDOT and Participant.
- 11. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.
- 12. This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 13. This Agreement shall terminate upon disbursement by the Escrow Agent of all money held by it in the escrow account in accordance with the instructions given by FDOT's Comptroller or designee and notification from FDOT to Escrow Agent that the account is to be closed.






